Care of Creation/Westport Eco Congregation

COP26 came to a close late on Saturday Nov.13th. Its final document, the Glasgow Climate Pact, shows some signs of progress in the global effort to rapidly limit dangerous levels of warming, but not nearly enough, or fast enough. The conclusion is very disappointing. Our work is even more important now. The only way the leaders of the world will act with more urgency is if the public continue to pressurise them. Some reactions to the climate deal agreed at the conclusion of COP26

"I think today we can say with credibility that we've kept 1.5 (degrees Celsius) within reach. But its pulse is weak, and we will only survive if we keep our promises. (...) History has been made here in Glasgow." *COP26 President Alok Sharma* "COP26 has made some progress, but nowhere near enough to avoid climate disaster.... Leaders have extended by a year this window of opportunity to avert the worst of the climate crisis. The world urgently needs them to step up more decisively next

"This package is not perfect...... but it is real progress and elements of the Glasgow Package are a lifeline for my country. We must not discount the crucial wins covered in this package"
